Congratulations to all our wonderful volunteers – Religious and Lay. Our last fifty years have been very well spent as “Labourers in the Harvest”.

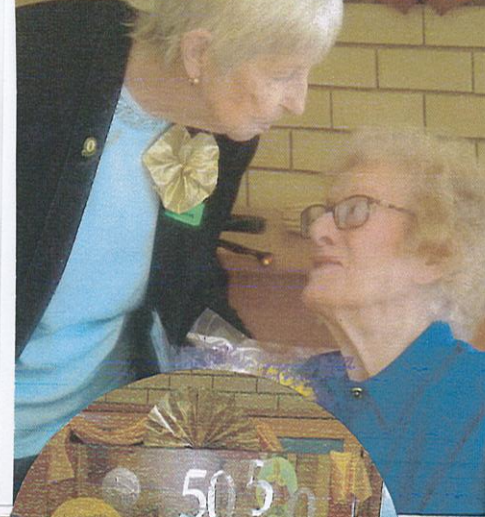
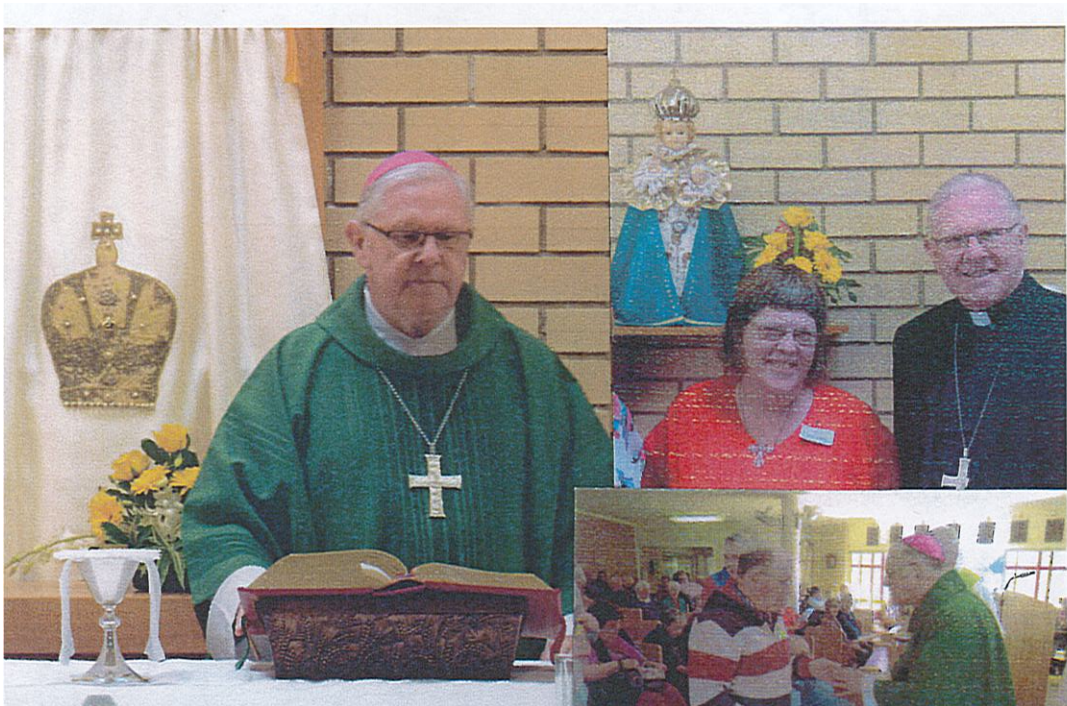
And as we say before each activity –

And after each activity with the disabled

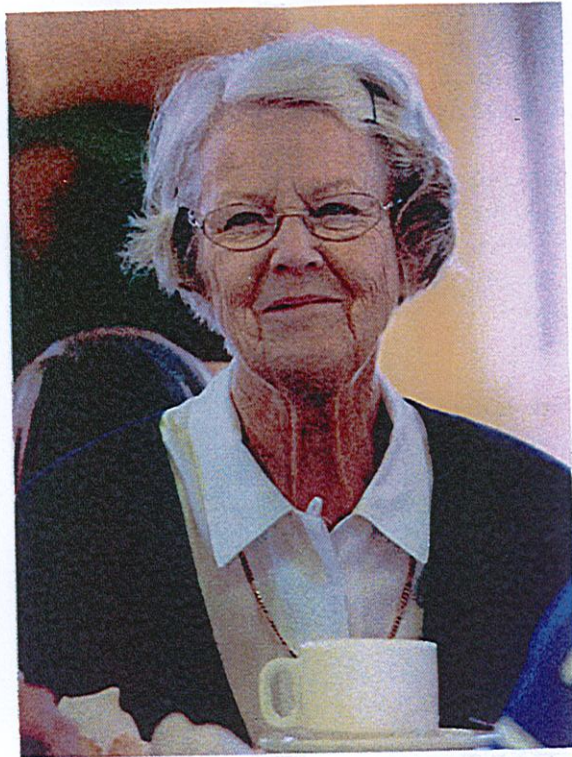
*“Thank you dear Jesus, for being our friend, here, at home, and wherever we go today.”*
