

BAD MEMORIES

If your stress levels are constantly throug the roof, researchers have found another reason to take it easy. A new study found that people who are easily distressed are more likely to have memory problems than easy-going people. The study, published in 'Neurology', followed more than 1200 people for 12 years. It found that those who often have negative emotions such as depression and anxiety, were 40% more likely to develop mild cognitive impairment than those least prone to negative emotions. These findings suggest that over many years chronic stress affects the parts of the brain that look after stress response and memory.
